
Tennis and Pickleball



Mike Lawver was hired by S&S Management as Director of Tennis at Heritage Palms on March 13, 2000. The six-court facility and small pro shop had been completed several months prior. All clay courts were lighted and had four water jugs servicing the courts plus a Playmate ball machine. Within the first few months several facility improvements were made: benches for the players, pro shop counters, and a canvas shade structure between courts #1 and #2 for spectators.



Initially there were 13 member-tennis players using the courts several times a week. To jump start the program we offered a non-resident Tennis membership. This is a common practice with developers of similar country clubs. Within the first two years we recruited over 100 non-resident members. We had also organized many Ladies' and men's Lee County and USTA teams. The success of the program also attracted an equal number of new HP tennis playing residents. With this rapid growth Lennar/US Homes added two lighted courts (#7 & #8) along with an adjacent parking lot. The two courts were originally planned to be installed at the lodge. Having the eight courts all together allowed for us to field two league matches at the same time and run larger events. It also made daily maintenance manageable.

We were getting close to maximum capacity and therefore eliminated any new non-resident memberships. Fast forward, several years later after raising the membership dues multiple times plus natural attrition our tennis playing membership was at its busiest ever though we had only 20 outside members left. Our tennis program has stabilized and continues today with a similar number of active players.
